22 23 24	The board welcomed Anthony Khawaja, Collier County's Chief Traffic Operation Engineer to provide updates as to the DOT projects currently underway in Collier County.
25 26	Mr. Khawaja informed the board that there are two DOT projects with the most impact on the Lely communities.

- 27 The first is the I75 Collier interchange at Davis Blvd. This will allow you to get onto the
- ramp heading South to Miami or North without having to go through the Davis

- 1 intersection. Same if you are exiting, you will exit off the ramp and be dropped off right
- 2 by the business circle south of Davis Blvd. This will improve the section of Davis and
- 3 the ramps and carry a lot of the traffic going to Lely or Marco away from the Davis
- 4 intersection. The project is currently under construction and is estimated to be
- 5 completed in the next 3 years.
- 6 The second project with the most impact on Lely is widening of 951 to a six lane from
- 7 Manatee all the way to Tower Road. This affects Marco more than anything but traffic
- 8 flowing south will see some effects in the surrounding area as well.
- 9 Mr. Khawaja was unsuccessful in securing right of way for Lely at the roundabout to the
- 10 shop entrance on corner of U.S. 41 and Collier Blvd. Members and residents are asked
- 11 to continue monitoring congestion in this location and to provide any photos of any
- 12 backed up traffic to Mr. Khawaja. A signal might need to be added in the future to help
- 13 with the congestion. If a signal is added at a private road it is up to that private entity to
- 14 cover the cost of adding the signal.
- Mr. Dorrill asked Mr. Khawaja to give an update to the board surrounding the VanderbiltBeach Rd. extension.
- 17 Mr. Khawaja informed the board that construction has commenced on the Vanderbilt
- 18 Extension project which is a large project estimated to cost the county around \$150M.
- 19 The project extends Vanderbilt Road all the way to 16th St. N.E. in the Golden Gate
- 20 Estates. This project includes canal relocation and the addition of four bridges and
- 21 three traffic signals. The project should be completed in about two more years. This
- 22 will hopefully remove some of the congestion on Immokalee Road once completed.
- 23 Another project is going to be implementing a connection on Veterans Memorial
- Boulevard to U.S. 41 to allow a connection between Livingston Rd. and U.S. 41 before
- 25 getting to Bonita Beach Rd.
- 26 It was also mentioned that Governor DeSantis recently announced his road projects
- 27 plan to widen portions of I75 throughout the State. Plans will begin to be formulated to
- widen the Collier County portion of 175 in 2024.
- 29 Mr. Dorrill and the board took this time to thank Mr. Khawaja for the information he
- 30 provided and stated their appreciation for all he is doing for the community.
- 31 A five-minute break was then taken in the proceedings.
