19	INVOCATION/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE
20	Mr. Dorrill offered an invocation, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited in unison.
21	PUBLIC COMMENT
22	No public comment was received at this time.
23	ROLL CALL/APPROVAL OF AGENDA
24	The following additions were made to the agenda:
25	Mr. Campkin - Ethics course and review the problem about who owns the lake banks.
26	Dr. Bularzik - Thank you to LCDD staff for the work completed.

- 1 Mr. Dorrill Move item 5b to 3a regarding supervisor vacancy.
- 2 Mr. Lee Election of officers following supervisor vacancy and the lighting at Lely
- 3 entrance off of U.S. 41.
- 4 The agenda was unanimously approved as amended on a MOTION by Mr.
- 5 Campkin with a second by Mr. Drum.
- 6 A. Supervisor Vacancy
- 7 This was to fill the vacancy that resulted from Mr. LoMonte's resignation. This was
- 8 continued from last month and was re-advertised through a public notice that appeared
- 9 on the LCDD website and through the President's Council. The two applicants are Mary
- 10 Ellen Young and Andy Fox. Both candidates introduced themselves. Ms. Young was the
- 11 President for the Ascot board for three of the four years that she was on the Board. Ms.
- 12 Young is an active member of the community from being the President of The Naples
- Walking Club to volunteering at her church. Mr. Fox shared that he has been a Lely
- resident for 14 years on a part-time basis and has been residing on a full-time basis the
- 15 last six years. He has a home in Tiger Island and another in Ole. He has been the
- 16 President in Tiger Island.
- 17 Mr. Lee made a MOTION to nominate Andy Fox with a second by Mr. Drum. Dr.
- 18 Bularzik and Mr. Campkin opposed.
- 19 Mr. Drum made a MOTION to table the vote until the next meeting. Mr. Campkin
- 20 seconded with three in favor, one opposed.
- 21 B. Election of Officers
- There was no election of officers at this time.
- 23 APPROVAL OF MINUTES DECEMBER 2023
- 24 The following changes were proposed to the minutes:
- 25 Page 4 line 14 Stock should be capitalized
- 26 Page 8 line 5 lien should be spelled as such
- 27 Page 2 line 11 should be guit not guite
- 28 Page 2 line 18 birdwatchers

- 1 Page 2 line 21 delete the word society
- 2 Page 5 line 14 December 31, 2024
- 3 Page 6 line 15 Stewart should be spelled as such
- 4 Page 6 Line 16 should be Cardinal Management not Premier District Management
- 5 Page 6 Line 20 Stewart should be spelled as such
- 6 Page 7 line 11 should be changed to 'the pothole'
- 7 The minutes were approved as amended on a MOTION by Dr. Bularzik with a
- 8 second by Mr. Campkin.
- 9 MANAGER'S REPORT
- 10 A. December Community Patrol
- 11 There were 83 actionable items in December. There were 9 property damage or
- maintenance issues. There was an incident at Sunstone Community which resulted in
- 13 complaints to enforce deed restrictions around the hot tub area. It is not the LCDD's job
- to enforce the deed restrictions. There was a total of nine suspicion incidents. There
- were six automobile accident standbys or assists. There were 89 total stops, 55 resulted
- in written warnings, and seven were citations with associated fines. There was one drug
- 17 related arrest.
- 18 **ATTORNEY'S REPORT**
- 19 A. Letter of No Objection, BCC
- 20 Attorney Pires presented a resolution that says what the previous proposed affidavit
- 21 said. It ensures that the property is not subject to the District's non-ad-valorem
- 22 assessments. On a MOTION by Dr. Bularzik and a second by Mr. Drum, with all in
- 23 favor, the Chairman was authorized to sign the resolution.
- 24 B. Pump House Parcel
- 25 Mr. Pires presented aerial photographs. This is regarding the roadway easement as
- 26 discussed at previous meetings. Mr. Pires determined that the Master cannot fence the
- 27 road as it would interfere with the District's easement. The District has ingress and
- 28 egress over all the properties between Wildflower and the irrigation parcel.

- 1 Mr. Drum said that the Master is supposed to maintain the road next to the dog park
- 2 and there are serious asphalt problems there. He said there is standing water. Dr.
- 3 Bularzik said she has had many conversations with them about this. The potholes were
- 4 filled in with stone for the time being until the rainy season ended and they could put
- 5 asphalt down. Dr. Bularzik proposed the LCDD write a letter to the Master Association
- 6 advising them about the action needed on the road and give them a deadline to do so.
- 7 On a MOTION by Dr. Bularzik with a second by Mr. Campkin, the board was
- 8 authorized to send this letter to the Master Association with all in favor.
- 9 C. Letter to Stock re: 558
- 10 This was discussed at the meeting last month. Comments were made by the engineer,
- so Attorney Pires revised the letter. The revised letter will be sent out today or the
- 12 following day. Attorney Pires will copy the Board when it goes out.

13 **FINANCIALS**

- 14 These were the financials of November 30, 2023. On the balance sheet there was
- 15 \$5,261,000 in cash on hand. There was \$3.2 million as required in the capital and
- 16 contingency reserve. There was \$2,068,000 in the operating account. There were
- 17 \$125,000 in payables. \$860,000 was received in non-ad-valorem assessments. Mr.
- 18 Dorrill suspects that December will be high in assessments received also. There has
- been \$874,000 in non-ad-valorem assessments received, year-to-date. \$20,000 was
- accrued in interest income in November. Total insurance premiums were \$101,000. It
- was prepaid for the year to achieve discounts. November was a big month for annual
- flowers and mulch. All other cost centers are within budget. Streetlighting cost \$10,000
- this month. Mr. Dorrill asked Mr. Carter what that was for. Mr. Carter said there was a
- lot of major streetlight work that had to be done. Several communities reported the main
- 25 roads had streetlights out. He was unsure if it was storm related. The County increased
- the rate of their irrigation water by 10%. At the end of the month everything was \$89,000
- 27 under budget. The CSA fee was paid by the Master Association.
- 28 The financials were accepted on a MOTION by Dr. Bularzik with a second by Mr.
- 29 Campkin, with all in favor.
- 30 A. Transfer to Capital Reserve
- This was completed in December and will be reflected in the financials next month.

1 **SUPERVISORS' REQUESTS**

2 A. Ethics Course

- 3 Mr. Campkin completed the course and needs reimbursement. Mr. Dorrill asked for a
- 4 receipt and said he would be happy to reimburse him on behalf of the District.

5 B. Lake Bank

- 6 Mr. Campkin asked about whether the lake banks were owned by Lely CDD or by the
- 7 Homeowner's Associations. Mr. Carter said on the property appraiser's website the
- 8 appraiser's outline can sometimes include too much or too little, so it makes it look like
- 9 they own more than they do. Mr. Pires said the appraiser website only reflects owners
- 10 not who has easements. Mr. Pires said that a lake tract may be owned by an entity but
- 11 there may be easements for that tract by the District. Mr. Pires said that just because
- 12 you manage an area does not mean you need to mow it. The owner would be
- 13 responsible, not the easement holder.

14 C. Location of Streetlights

- 15 Mr. Lee made a comment about that entrance coming into Lely from 41 when you are
- making a lefthand turn. Has had residents stating it is not well lit at the entrance. He
- 17 said they are at the maximum capacity for lighting, in order to add lighting some would
- have to be taken away from the Freedom Horses. He suggested the engineer look at it
- and make a suggestion. Mr. Dorrill said in years past they had a retired FPL engineer
- 20 do a study and measure the illumination levels. He will try to find that study. None of the
- board members personally had issues lacking light or visibility when making this turn.

22 D. Staff

- 23 Dr. Bularzik thanked Mr. Carter for taking care of a streetlight issue and Mr. Bowers for
- patrolling. New cars for Lely Patrol were purchased that were not yet detailed, patrol
- 25 hours were not cut back.

26 PUBLIC COMMENT

- 27 Karen Risch Ole Suggested posting back up material so residents can reference
- 28 when reading through the minutes. Asked about the community patrol report and where
- the information for it comes from, if it is the Sheriff's Department or Lely Patrol. Dr.
- 30 Bularzik said it is both. Asked about who maintains hedges. Mr. Carter said that the
- 31 CDD maintains a lot of the hedges. Mr. Carter offered to meet with Ms. Risch and point
- 32 out hedges are managed by the CDD and which are managed by individual

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- 1 communities. A car drove over some landscaping. Ms. Risch wanted to know whose
- 2 property it is before replacing it. She said it was previously put in by Stock or Ole. Mr.
- 3 Carter said whoever initially put it in would still be the responsible party. Mr. Dorrill
- 4 thinks it is Ole's responsibility, but Mr. Carter can look at the area to confirm.

5 **ADJOURNMENT**

- 6 The next meeting will be February 21, 2024, at 1:30 p.m. A Lake Bank Restoration
- 7 workshop is scheduled for 1 p.m., with the regular meeting to follow. **On a MOTION by**
- 8 Mr. Lee, and a second by Mr. Campkin the meeting was adjourned at 2:43 p.m.
